


Thank You to all these parents and teachers for teaching our young

BSM MA CH 1 hosted the Red Sox Foundation & Massachusetts General Hospital Home Base Program, at the Leominster Veterans' Center, for a panel discussion of Iraq/Afghanistan Veterans and Families. The Red Sox Foundation & MGH Home Base Program serves returning veterans and their military families affected by the "invisible"

wounds of war" – post traumatic stress and traumatic brain injury. The community at large was invited as well as members of veterans groups and BSM's. The March 3rd event, coordinated by Co-Presidents Susan Hall and Maureen O'Gorman, attracted an audience of over 50 people including members from all three MA BSM Chapters.





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VAVS CONFERENCE MARCH 5 AND 6, 2013



Robin Barnes-McCarthy and Anne Parker recently represented BSMA at the VAVS conference. VAVS stands for Veterans Affairs Voluntary Services. This is the part of each VA Hospital that administers volunteer efforts in each facility. BSMA as well as many VSO's and other organizations (such as Knights of Columbus, for example) certify representatives (called Rep's) and deputy representatives (called Dep's).

The VAVS representative for BSMA certifies the representative of each chapter and encourages them to appoint a deputy. The requirement for the representative and/or her deputy is that they attend all four quarterly meetings at the facility where they are certified. The representative and deputy should be a member in good standing of each chapter and be able to attend these meetings and coordinate the chapter's members' volunteering at the facility.

Each facility has unique volunteer operations. At the conference , a variety of volunteer opportunities (aside from the traditional ones) include:

- A. Collecting personal care items, magazines, and DVD's for the patients.
- B. Reading and visiting with patients.
- C. Organizing bingo and other games for patients.
- D. Serving coffee in outpatient areas as well as offering magazines.
- E. Administrative work including confirming patient appointments and filing.
- F. Helping with homeless Stand downs usually held yearly at local VA hospitals. These provides services and clothes to the homeless veterans
- G. Van drivers to transport veterans to appointments and golf cart drivers at some facilities to take veterans from outlying parking areas.
- H. Valentines for veterans
- I. National cemeteries guides and clerical

There are innovative programs like "No Veteran Dies Alone "where volunteers sit with Veterans during their last hour; modified sporting events for handicapped veterans; youth volunteers (units can sponsor volunteers for the summer), and My Healthe Vet website for veterans to communicate with the VA medical providers.

My Healthe Vet is the VA's online personal health record. It was designed for Veterans, active duty Service members, their dependents and caregivers. My Healthe Vet helps veterans partner with their health care team. It provides veterans opportunities and tools to make informed decisions and manage their health care.

Specific features in My HealtheVet are available to veterans based on their account type. All users who have a <u>Basic</u> account are able to view their self-entered information. If the veteran is a VA patient, they can upgrade their account to <u>Advanced</u> or <u>Premium</u>.

Among the newest features available to Veterans with a Premium Account are VA Notes. These are clinical notes that their health care team records during their appointments or hospital stays. Also available are VA Immunization records, more detailed lab reports and a list of current medical issues. These features are in addition to prescription refills, VA Appointments and Secure Messaging – all very popular with Veterans!

Big Dipper Has Announced a Theme for Fun Night 2013!



- 23-year-old Lance Cpl. Roger Muchnick had served in the Marines for about three years. He was from Fairfield, Connecticut. He'd been to Afghanistan and was thinking about returning to college after enlistment ended.
- 26-year-old Corporal Aaron Ripperda was a football player in high school in Highland, Illinois. His former assistant principal says he was respectful and hardworking.
- 20-year-old Lance Cpl. David Fenn of Polk City, Florida joined the Marines in 2010. He received several awards including the Combat Action Ribbon and National Defense Service Medal.
- 21-year-old Lance Cpl. Mason Vanderwork of Hickory, North Carolina also joined the Marines in 2010. He was most recently deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in 2011. He also had several awards while serving.
- 21-year-old Lance Cpl. William Wild of Anne Arundel, Maryland was also deployed for Operation Enduring Freedom in 2011. He had several awards including the Sea Service Deployment Ribbon and Global War on Terrorism Service Medal among others.
